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Dear Parent/Carer

Academic reports for all students in Years 7-10 are now available to view on INSIGHT. This is the first of 3 academic reports you will receive regarding your child's progress this academic year.

We are currently developing a reporting system that focuses on your child's progress in each subject. You will be provided with information that relates directly to the curriculum studied over that term, allowing you and your child to identify clear areas for improvement along with key areas for celebration and praise. The Autumn report marks the first stage in creating this system which will be fully embed by the end of the academic year.

As we have faced two years of disruption to school life, it feels timely to revisit how you can find your child's academic report on INSIGHT and go through the new reporting system.

Insight

Insight is the platform Moor Park High School and Sixth Form use to share information regarding your child's progress. The platform is refreshed daily allowing you to view the most accurate data regarding:

- Academic reports
- Homework tasks set by class teachers
- Attendance including morning and afternoon marks
- Merits
- Behaviour points
- Detentions

To get the full benefit of INSIGHT we recommend logging on through the internet and not downloading the app. We have also found that bigger screens work better (tablets and computers compared to mobile phones). The webpage for INSIGHT can be found on the homepage of the school's website; we have placed it in a large orange box so that it is easy to locate. You can also [CLICK HERE](#).

You will have been sent an invite for INSIGHT when your child started at Moor Park. If you have forgotten your log-in details, click on the 'don't know your password' button and input the email address that you provided to school and click submit. A pop-up will tell you if your username is recognised or if your password reset has been sent to you. If the pop-up says that your username is not recognised please ring the office on 01772 795428 who will assist you.

New reporting system

When you open the report for your child you will see a table for each subject and several statements. It is important to note that the statements relate to the content studied that term and therefore the statements may change with each report.

Your child will receive a red, amber, green or blue for each of the statements. Each class teacher has selected a colour that applies to your child's progress that term. This selection is based on classwork and assessments completed throughout the term. The colour is personal to your child and the progress they are making towards the curriculum studied at Moor Park High School.

The progress made in each subject is graded with the scale:

Blue	Making exceptional progress, significantly above what is expected.
Green	Making better than expected progress.
Amber	Making progress at the expected pace. Most pupils will be in this group.
Red	Not making as much progress as expected.
X	X is used if this topic could not be assessed because of absence or for any other reason.

Also visible on your child's report is their attendance and number of sessions late. Year 10 reports also show their end of term assessment percentage along with the class average percentage so you can compare your child's result and understand their progress a little more.

Should you wish to view the curriculum in more detail, each subject publishes their long-term plan on the school website underneath the 'High School' then 'Curriculum' heading.

How can I support my child?


Parents play a crucial role in supporting their children's learning. Evidence suggests that effective parental engagement can lead to learning gains of +3 months over the course of a year. You can support your child by:

- Discussing the school report with your child. Talk about what they have been learning, what they have enjoyed, any difficulties they may have and why that may be the case.
- Look through your child's exercise books with them. Listen to them explain what they have learnt.
- Give your child a quiet place to learn. Encourage them to review 'red' statements, using one of the resources we provide for them to learn independently at home. This includes:
 - The personal copies of textbooks and resources we have issued
 - The [Oak National Academy](#) (Developed over the pandemic by class teachers. A national resource for all subjects which includes lessons, videos, quizzes and worksheets)
 - [GCSEPOD](#) (Audio-visual teaching and learning resources for all subjects)

Your child will receive a second report at the end of the Spring term which will relate to progress made towards the curriculum studied between Christmas and Easter. On the report you will also receive an attitude to learning and homework grade for each subject.
