Enrichment sessions will take place every Wednesday from 13:50pm – 15:30pm.

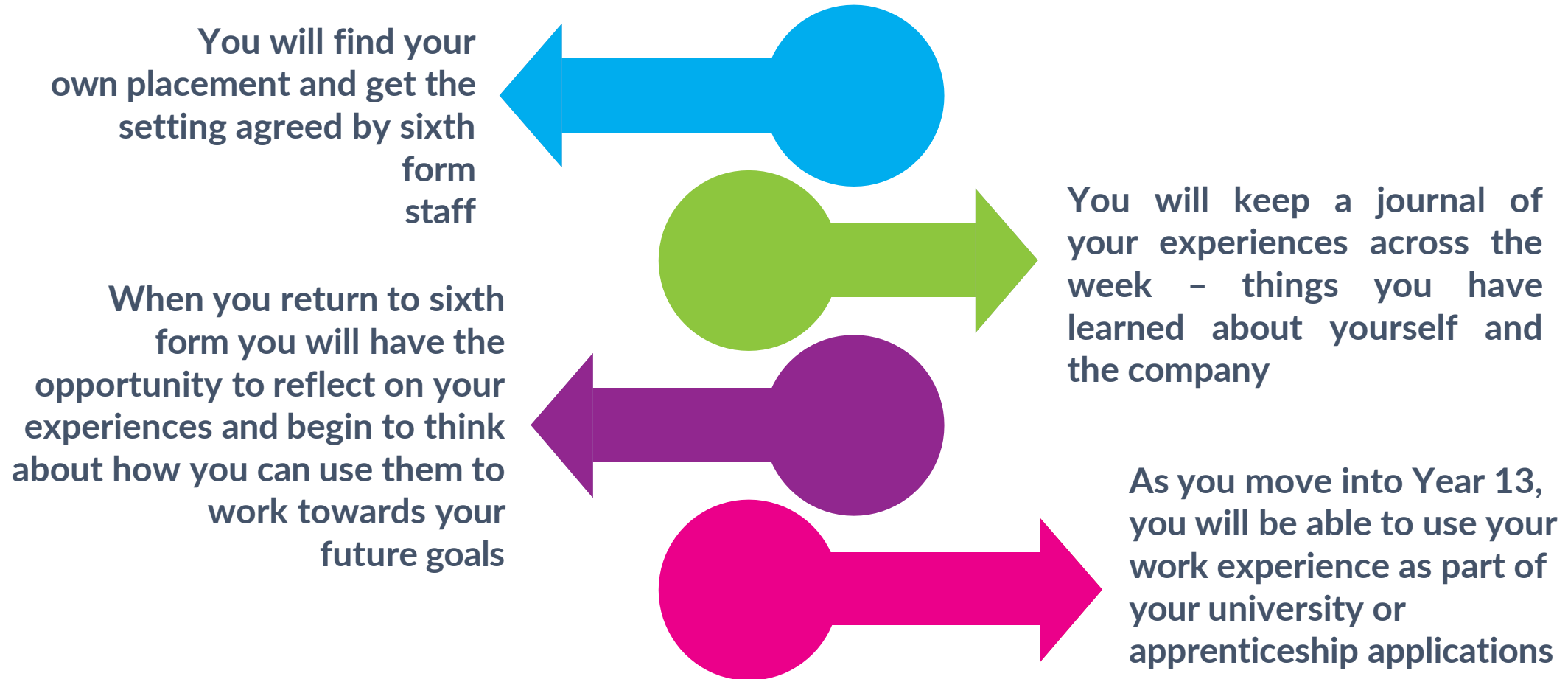
Sessions are run by teachers and external speakers, such as industry professionals and university lecturers.

University Trips

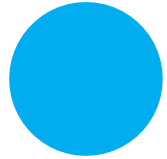
All students go on at least 1 university trip across Year 12, in addition to talks and visits from university representatives in the sixth form centre

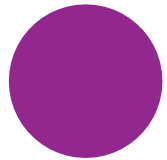

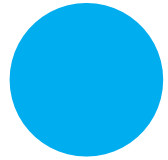

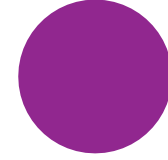
